#### THE HISTORY DEPARTMENT

The Department is extremely well resourced and occupies a suite of spacious and suitably equipped rooms in the Faculty area on the first floor of the new building. All classrooms have interactive whiteboards. There is good access to recently upgraded ICT rooms on all three floors.

# **History in the Lower School**

In Year 7 pupils study different aspects of Medieval Britain in Terms 1 & 2. In Term 3 they study Tudor monarchy and religion.

Year 8 work involves studying the changing relationship between the Monarchy and Parliament between 1500 and 1750. Pupils will also learn about the British Empire, the Transatlantic Slave Trade and the Industrial Revolution.

Year 9 pupils study Twentieth Century History. Pupils will cover World War One and the Era of the Second World War. Pupils also have the opportunity to attend a residential field trip to the Belgian battlefields during the spring term.

# **GCSE History**

Pupils opting for the subject in Years 10-11 will follow the Edexcel GCSE syllabus. They will study Medicine through time, Nazi Germany, The Cold War and Anglo-Saxon England and the Norman Conquest.

### **AS/A Level History**

The students follow the Edexcel A Level History syllabus. The students study examined units on Communist China and Russia and the Tudor State. They will also produce a coursework assignment on a topic from within the Russian course in their final year.
